providing long term prenatal and infant care A partnership with the Family of God congregation in Southwest Detroit and the Michigan District-LCMS enables the

clinic to meet the needs of the most vulnerable mothers and babies in Detroit. Penny was instrumental in the visioning and start up of the clinic 5 years ago and is passionate about providing a safe and loving environment for women to find support, encouragement and excellent medical care during their pregnancies. Penny will share stories of struggle and hope at the Council's spring meeting on Monday, April 29th at St. Paul Lutheran Church in Northville (behind Kroger grocery store).
