Rev. David A. Davis, 13th president of the Michigan District, earned a B.A. from Concordia University Ann Arbor in 1979 and an M.Div. from Concordia Seminary in St. Louis, Mo. In 1983. Since his ordination,



Rev. Davis served as pastor of four different congregations, all in Michigan. He has served in various LCMS leadership positions, planted congregations,

developed a multicultural ministry, led nonprofit governance seminars, developed mentoring processes, wrote leadership development materials, and facilitated meetings and retreats. He authored a book, Toward Significance: A Guide For Pastoring Well, and has a blog with the same name (towardsignificance.com/blog). Rev.
